

Should Homeschooling be encouraged in India?

Description

What is Homeschooling:-

In Favor :-

- Competitive spirit may not develop.
- Children who are being homeschooled will <u>more likely to skip schedule</u> than the children who are regular school going, because of less restrictions.
- Homeschoolers may not be as discipline as school going children.

Parents should have the <u>right to decide</u> the way of learning for their children. At present many institutes are not giving admission to the children who are homeschooled.
